

# 'Changing Power of the Monarchy'

## **Literacy**

Our literacy learning will be based on Shackleton's Journey by William Grill. We will be creating a formal letter.

## **Maths**

Our first focus will be to expand our knowledge fractions, we will be looking into equivalent fractions, then moving on to look into adding and subtracting fractions.

## **Science**

In Science, we will be continuing to learn about light before moving on to making new substances. We will be looking at reversible and irreversible changes.

## **Computing and E-Safety**

In E-Safety, we will be looking at cyber bullying. In computing we will be looking at the concept of repetition, looking at the difference between count-controlled and infinite loops, in programming using the Scratch environment.

## **Religious Education**

This half term our concept is Symbols. We will be looking at how stones are used as symbols in Buddhist traditions.

## **History**

Our history learning this half term will focus on the changing power in the monarchy. We will be studying King John, King James I, Queen Anne and Queen Victoria.

## **Physical Education**

PE for Class 4 will be on Mondays and Thursdays. Aspire Coaching will work with the class on Mondays, they will be studying the netball/basketball. On Thursdays the class will be doing gymnastics, focusing on spins.

## **RHE**

## **Music**

Our music lessons will focus on learning about timbre. We will be practicing and learning new songs for the Petersfield Music Festival on 20<sup>th</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> March.
