Great Queens Wrens Cluster Sheet



3rd January to 10th February 2023

What are we going to be learning?

The hook for a lot of our learning this half term is 'Great Queens'. This will be led by our history learning about Queen Elizabeth I, Queen Victoria and Queen Elizabeth II. Following the history learning the children will be asked to record anything they have learnt using simple pictures and words and phrases. Within our literacy lessons the children become familiar with the story 'The Queen's Hat' by Steve Antony and then sequence some pictures and write words about where the hat went. They will also become familiar with the story 'The Queen's Knickers' by Nicholas Allan and write a letter to a royal visitor with a list of things to see in Froxfield. In maths the Wrens will continue to develop their subitising skills. They will also develop their counting skills and understanding of ordinality and cardinality. In our science learning the children will begin to understand some important processes and changes in the natural world including seasons and changing states of matter. In PE with Active8 on a Tuesday the children will develop their throwing skills, aiming at a target. Thursday's PE with Mrs Ingham Thomas will be gymnastics. Our Concept for RE will be 'Special' in the context of the special books. In computing the children will explore making simple lines using 2Simple computer programme. In music the children will begin to explore timbre using different percussion instruments and their voices and they will explore notating and responding to picture cues, signs and symbols. In art we will be developing our drawing skills with different activities such as keeping our pencil on the page for a continuous line drawing and small observational drawings. During Design Technology the children will be food tasting and making a simple 'Royal Sandwich'.
