Let's Play Larks Cluster Sheet



5th June to 21st July 2023

What are we going to be learning?

The hook for a lot of our learning this half term is 'Let's Play' a history led topic. In our literacy we will be reading 'Toys in Space' by Mini Grey where the children will write a description of the missing teddy in the form of a LOST Poster. They will also look at some non-fiction texts about toys and write several sentences in a simple non-narrative form to convey ideas and information, including appropriate vocabulary. In maths the Larks will develop their understanding of numbers between 10 and 20 including addition and subtraction facts. They will also revisit money and time. Our science learning will be about habitats, Larks will learn that animals and plants live in different habitats and that they have to adapt accordingly. We will also continue to monitor the weather to embed understanding of the seasons. In history we will be looking at toys from the past. This will focus on toys in living memory and then further into the past. PE with Active8 will focus on invasion games such as tag and the children will be developing their agility, balance and co-ordination with me on a Thursday. Our concept for RE will be 'Community as authority' in the context of authority in the Christian and Hindu faiths. In computing, children will consolidate their knowledge of programming sequences using bee-bots and begin to link this to simple coding blocks using Scratch Inr software. In music the children will focus on dynamics and tempo as well as rehearsing and performing. For Art, the children will be exploring print-making using different techniques including found objects, rubbings and line prints on print tiles.
