#### What are we going to be learning?

Over the past term, we have spent time building confidence and have also begun to support age appropriate independence, by means of dressing and undressing. These core skills are important for 'school readiness. This term, we shall be nurturing resilience, another tool which children need to learn to help them navigate tricky situations.

The more that children are able to manage on their own, the more they internalise the message that they are strong and capable. When children have the skills and confidence to confront and work through problems, they are more likely to take healthy risks, are curious and creative and don't fear of falling short of expectations. This in turn, helps them to reach their long-term goals and resolve problems independently.

#### How to support learning at home:

We all want to make sure that are children are happy and will try and shelter them from upset and disappointment. However, experiencing a little bit of disappointment can help your child learn that upset doesn't last long and can be overcome. Reframe challenges as short-term problems and opportunities for learning. Support your child by encouraging them to come up with a possible solution to the problem. Tell stories or talk about times when you have overcome a problem by persevering or having a go and how this made you stronger as a result. And praise those times that your child has attempted something opposed to succeeding. This in turn will send the message that it is having a go that is important.

#### Background Artist: Andy Goldsworthy



We shall be continuing to explore the work of Andy Goldsworthy. His artwork consists of sculptures, photography and land art, created from natural materials. Over the coming weeks, we will use resources found on our walks in the woods, to make our own masterpieces. We shall also explore repeating patterns.

## Focus Text: Mrs Mopple's Washing Line by: Anita Hewitt



This half term, we shall be encouraging the children to look more closely at the pictures within the story, using them as clues to what might be about to happen.
