Literacy

Literacy learning this term will be based around the text 'Beowulf' retold by Rob Lloyd Jones (a shorter version). Class 3 will be writing an additional chapter in the style of the original story and creating their own instructions on how to slay their own mythical creature.

Maths

We will continue to focus on learning multiplication and division facts and applying them to problems. As well as identifying and representing unit fractions.

Science

In Science, we will continue to focus on animals, skeletons and movement. We will learn the functions of the skeleton and identify animals that are invertebrates and vertebrates.

Computing and E-safety

In computing we will be using the programme LOGO to plan, modify and test commands to create shapes and patterns.

Religious Education

Our Concept Days this half term will be linked to the key concept of 'Freedom' in the context of Passover.

History

Our topic this half term is all about the Anglo-Saxons. We will be learning about how they came to Britain and developed communities and kingdoms, as well as the life, culture, art and religion they followed.
