Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a busy start to the Spring Term. Class 3 enjoyed a visit to the Children's Concert in Guildford this week and Class 1 had a valuable trip to the Scotts' farm linked to their current learning cluster.

As a school, we value the close links we have with the local cluster of small schools, The Petersfield School and Bedales, all of which enable the curriculum to be enriched for our children in different ways. This week, a small group of Class 4 children enjoyed an art morning at Dunhurst, benefitting from their excellent facilities and specialist teaching. Bedales will also be hosting two music events over the coming weeks.

It is very much the ethos at Froxfield to provide the children with a broad and balanced learning experience. High priority is placed on the key skills of reading, writing and maths but we place equal emphasis on other areas of the curriculum including the arts, sport and humanity subjects. We are always looking for opportunities for children to be involved in inter-school or community events to support their development in these areas.

I know that the extensive trip/visit programme offered at Froxfield is something that our children and families value. We are very aware of the financial burden these can place on families and do all we can to keep the costs of these visits to a minimum. Unfortunately, the school is not in the financial position to subsidise our extracurricular offer. Please can I ask for your support in ensuring financial contributions for visits are made promptly in order to avoid additional work for our admin team, chasing payments.

In an exciting development, Mrs Hollis's dog Conker has successfully undertaken training to become a Therapy Dog. There is a plethora of research around the positive impact of pets on emotional well-being and anxiety. As their heartbeat is much slower than ours, stroking a dog has been shown to calm the human heart rate. We are currently putting the necessary protocol and guidance in place and hope to see Conker in school soon. Initially, he will come into class to meet and be introduced to the children. Following this, we will identify a small number of children who may benefit from more focused time with Conker either to support reading or emotional confidence and well-being. For these children, a permission letter will be sent to parents before the sessions start.

We would like to pass on our congratulations and good wishes to Miss Hickey who is expecting a baby in March. She will begin her Maternity Leave after half-term and I am sure you will join me in wishing her well with her new arrival. We will look forward to welcoming her back in due course but, in the interim, her role in the office will be covered by Mrs Fry and Mrs Masters. Enjoy the time with your little one Miss Hickey and we look forward to meeting her soon.






CINDY'S CLUB BOOKINGS

WORLD BOOK DAY




World Book Day will be on 7th March. Children can dress up as their favourite book character. Whether it's a nod to a character or a full costume is up to your child but there is no need to buy anything.

Pre-School

What an exciting couple of weeks it has been in pre-school. The arrival of workmen, who had come to repair the village hall roof, sparked an interest in 'construction'. The scaffolding tower was a particular fascination and was reflected in play throughout the setting. The kind and incredibly patient workmen provided a jolly smile and waved to the numerous little faces that watched eagerly as they went up and down their ladders.

In our block area, we observed children building vertical towers that replicated that of the scaffolding and this was then used to move wooden characters up and down the differing levels of the block trolley. In the craft area, junk boxes were cut up and a host of 'joining' resources e.g. string, tape, straws and foil were used to fix the boxes together. The children learnt that the men were fixing a leak and this led to a deepened curiosity when some of the children attempted to test their models to see if they were waterproof!

The weather has also played a big part in our learning this week. The children noticed the difference in temperature and observed the changes that accompanied such a cold snap. Felix was amazed at how the water from a sponge was freezing, as he squeezed it, making icicles almost instantaneously! He and Archie were also amazed the following day, when the sponge had stuck to the wooden cable reel. There was lots of critical thinking as the two children considered how to remove it. Eventually, some warm water and the use of differing tools provided a solution...great problem solving!

We have also enjoyed a frosty walk. During which, we listened carefully to the crunch made by our wellies, as we moved across the crisp frost. The children discussed how to keep warm and compared their gloves to mittens, thick woolly socks to long fluffy tights and differences in hats, some of which had bobbles and some that had ear flaps...some wonderful interactions and conversations ensued as a result of our chilly adventure.
