What are we going to be learning?

The hook for a lot of our learning this half term is 'Old MacDonald had a Farm'. We will use this in our literacy when we become familiar with the story 'Farmer Duck' by Martin Waddell. The children will continue to learn new phoneme grapheme correspondents including digraphs and embed the phonemes learnt last term. This will enable them to become more confident and fluent readers and they will apply this phonic knowledge to early writing. In Maths the children will continue to build on their knowledge of subitising including beginning to quickly see subgroups within bigger numbers. They will also develop their ordering and counting skills to numbers beyond 20 and explore cardinality, the 'stopping number'. The children will continue to be encouraged to develop their interest and curiosity about the world around them including understanding the effect of the changing seasons on the natural world and where farmers keep their animals at this time of year. In PE with Active8 on a Tuesday the children will focus on throwing and aiming (under arm). Thursday's PE with Mrs Ingham Thomas will be gymnastics with a focus on balance. Our Concept for RE will be 'Special Places' in the context of a mandir, Hindu temple. During the half-term, we will practise our mouse control by completing simple activities on 'My World'. In art we will be exploring and experimenting with different materials to create a 3D sculpture. In music the children become familiar with a piece of music called Icy Music Box by Nakira and using it to think about length of sounds and simple structure of music.
