Our inaugural Artist in Residence, the award-winning young Irish artist **Camilla Hanney,** presents her first full exhibition in the Gallery. She has provided a creative response to the outstanding collection of ceramics housed here. Camilla's solo show invites new ways of viewing the Gallery's Wedgwood porcelain collection as well as the history of the Gallery and garden, formerly the property of the Curtis family.

Through the medium of clay, including a range of delicately constructed porcelain works, Camilla's work explores fragility, nature and the cycle of life and death. Alongside works that are a playful reference to the figures captured in traditional porcelain ornaments, the show also highlights the work of William Curtis the botanist and his studies of the natural world.

<u>Film Night Plus at Privett – Friday 23 February</u> <u>A Haunting in Venice</u>



Our second winter Film Night Plus at Privett is on Friday 23 February (note, *Friday*), where we are showing the film *A Haunting in Venice*, starring Kenneth Branagh as Agatha Christie's Hercule Poirot.

In post-World War II Venice, Poirot, now retired and living in self-imposed exile, reluctantly attends a séance. But when one of the guests is murdered, the former detective must put his little grey cells to work one more time to uncover the killer.

The film has touches of Gothic Horror alongside the sleuthing, and has been described as *"an enjoyable bit of hokum for a dark evening"* and *"lavish old-fashioned Hollywood entertainment"*. It has a 12A certificate.

Before the film we will be serving a taste of Italy – hearty platters of antipasti to share. And, of course, something sweet to follow. There will be a donations bar serving Italian bottled beer and wine.



The evening begins promptly at **7.00pm**, and the film should be finished by 10.15pm at the latest.



It has been a busy start to the Spring Term and children and staff returned to school ready to embrace the new year.

Already Froxfield children have been off on important learning trips; Class 3 enjoyed a visit to the Children's Concert in Guildford and Class 1 took a chilly walk through Froxfield to the Scotts' farm where the children learnt about their animals (including pigs, sheep, cows and chickens) and how to look after them.

rs Farrow was pleased to share with us the contents of a letter she received from our local MP Damien Hinds, who is now a schools minister. Mr Hinds wrote: "I am writing to congratulate you on your school's outstanding achievement in the 2023 Phonics Screening Check.

We want to ensure every child develops a firm grasp of phonics as the basis on which to improve standards of reading. As such I was delighted to see your results.

With 100 per cent of pupils in Year 1 at Froxfield Church of England Primary and Pre-School meeting the expected standard in the check, your school is in the top 1 per cent of all primary schools in the country.

The latest figures show that 83 per cent of pupils who met the expected standard in the check went on to achieve at least the expected standard in reading at key stage 2 in 2023, which underlines the importance of developing the ability to decode words effectively at an early age.

Froxfield School continued

Your particular success in teaching phonics and early reading so effectively means your pupils are developing a firm foundation, from which they can become increasingly fluent and develop a lifelong love of reading."

He went on to thank Mrs Farrow and her staff for their commitment and success in this vital area of early education - this is so well deserved - well done Froxfield staff - and children!

At the beginning of this term governors were invited to join the teachers and support staff from the local small schools at a safeguarding training session in Sheet School run by 'The Flying Child' - an organisation that aims to educate people who work with children about child sexual abuse (CSA).

The session was extremely powerful. Sophie Olsen, the founder of the organisation and a survivor of inter-familial CSA movingly explained the profound impact that CSA can have on a person's whole life.

The statistics of the incidence of CSA are shocking - a recent report estimates that around 1 in 6 girls and 1 in 20 boys are sexually abused before the age of 16. A teacher or a learning support assistant may well be the person to whom a child might disclose abuse and the way that person might react to a child's disclosure is vital. If the person to whom the child discloses seems disgusted or appears not to believe them this is likely to cause the child to shut down, maybe for years.

Sophie Olsen reminded us that that CSA can happen in ANY type of family. Ms Olsen stressed that she came from a very middle class family who lived in a large house, had as it seemed to the outside, a privileged life, the children had nice, clean, neat clothes were well fed and other than her retiring behaviour there were no outward signs of abuse.

I think all present were moved by the presentation and wanted to support the work of 'The Flying Child'. Sophie Olsen requested that we all go out and talk about the subject of CSA - to take the stigma away from the abused - she said "CSA is society's shame - not mine." and to visit the website <u>www.theflyingchild.com</u> - so I am hoping that in sharing this with readers I am helping in a very small way to promote the The Flying Child's aims.
